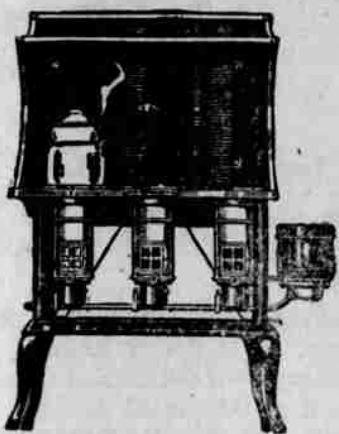

REUNION TO BE HELD SATURDAY

Umpqua Academy Association Plans Big Program to Be Given on June 2

W. C. HAWLEY TO SPEAK

Present Representative Was One of Early Instructors in School and Was Married to His Assistant

The seventh annual reunion of the Umpqua Academy association, will be held at Wilbur on Saturday June 2, and it is expected that there will be a better attendance and more interest than ever before. Letters have been received from all parts of the country from former students, stating that they expect to attend the reunion this year. The Umpqua Academy was founded in 1857 and its history ended in October 1900, when the property was taken over as a public school. During those years a great many of the men and women of the present time secured their education. A great many of them assumed prominent places in the political, business and professional life of the state but have never forgotten the pleasant times spent together in the old Methodist school where they received the strict discipline of the early sectarian academy together with a broad education.

An interesting program has been arranged this year for the reunion, the main feature being an address by Hon. Willis C. Hawley, representative from Oregon to Congress. Mr. Hawley, was elected as principal of the institution in 1884 and served for two years. It was while so engaged that he met Miss Anna Geisendorfer, who assisted him, and who later became Mrs. Hawley. Mr. Hawley has announced his intention of being present this year and has accepted the invitation to make the principal address of the day.

The program will start at 10 o'clock on Saturday morning with the song "America," sung by the entire assembly. The invocation will be delivered by Rev. F. A. Brown, followed by a welcome song, sung by a group of girls from the Wilbur school.

Mrs. Mary Hill Short will welcome the visitors on the part of the Wilbur school board, and the response will be made by Hon. George Riddle, a former student of the school, now commandant of the Oregon Soldiers Home.

After a vocal solo by Frank Grubbe, Mr. Hawley will deliver the main address of the day.

The memorial service will be conducted by Hon. J. W. Hamilton and will be followed by a vocal solo by Warren G. Burt.

The annual basket dinner will be served at twelve o'clock. Tables are to be spread in the gymnasium and everyone is invited to enjoy the basket dinner and the good time that will be had. Coffee, cream and sugar will be served by the ladies of Wilbur. George Bacon is to serve as toastmaster and a number of interesting talks are expected.

The afternoon will be given over to the business session of the organization. Hon. C. L. Chenoweth, president of the association will preside and will make the opening address. Mrs. O. C. Brown, secretary, will read the minutes of the last previous meeting and the reports of the standing committees will be received.

One of the interesting features of the afternoon session will be the presentation of the group picture containing the photographs of the

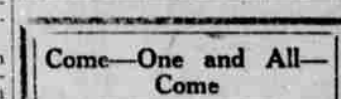
