GLENDALE WIFE BEATER ARRESTED

Chas. K. Palmer, an employe of the Glendale Lumber Co., at Fernvale, was arrested last Monday evening on complaint of his wife, Lotie Palmer, on a charge of assault and battery, and brought before Justice of the Peace A. C. Clark, of this city, says the Glendale News. He pleaded guilty and was allowed by the court to return to his work, sentence being suspended so that he could earn money to pay the expenses of clothing and care of his wife and three children and her railroad fare back to Flint, Mich., where her father and sister are living. The family are absolutely destitute, and a subscription was circulated here to get money and clothing to temporarily provide for the woman and her three little children.
