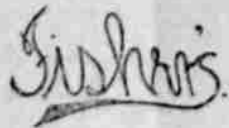

were false. Because of these facts the officers have been working to establish his identity since his capture took place.

Weekly this afternoon told the officers that in robbing the Glendale bank he had a well mapped plan of escape. He was familiar with all of the roads and trails and was planning on a direct route through the hills to the California line...

"If I had got across the Rogue river you couldn't have found men enough to stop me," he told Sheriff Starmer this afternoon. "I knew that was the worst place, but I didn't think the officers had had time to get there yet. The only other bad place I figured on was in crossing the Crescent City road, but I could have waited until dark to get across there if there had been any travel."

"It's a good thing Frank (Hopkins) had his shot gun instead of a revolver when he and Branham stopped me. If it had been a revolver I would have gone over the bank and shot it out with them, but I didn't like the looks of that big gun Frank was packing. I know I didn't have any chance with that."

He is expecting a heavy prison sentence as a result of his crime, and in discussing his escape from the Washington reformatory said that the five to twenty year sentence he received there was "nothing to what you fellows will give me."

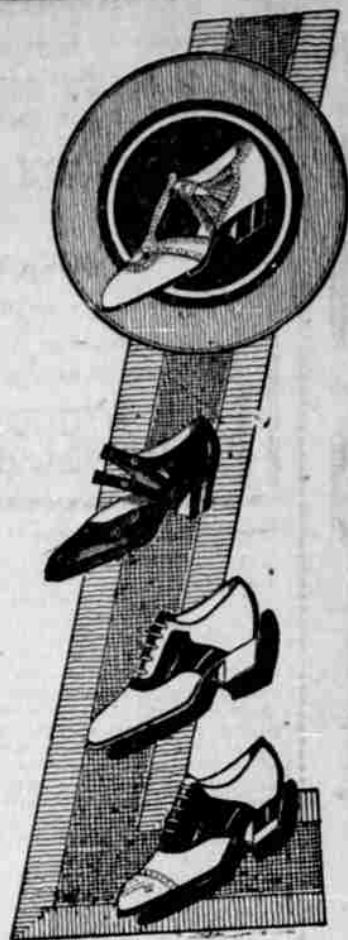
