



DUELIN, June 14.—(A. P.)—The Irish government is establishing a national censorship of cinema picnational censorship of cinema pic-tures. Hitherto managers have been carrying on such censorship as was provided in England, and many films were uncensored, but there was no uniformity and some public complaint of the exhibition of ob-jectional films. jectional films.
