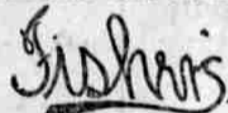

Mr. and Mrs. Roy Wilson and son spent yesterday in this city attending to business matters. They are residents of Boston.

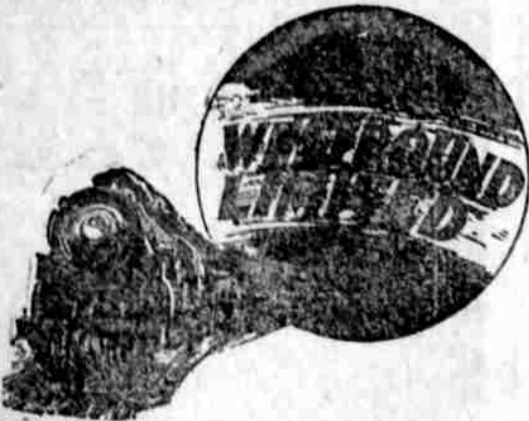
