TANKS ARE INFLAMMED

Tanks of Crude Oil Explode Showering Burning Contents for Distance of Two City Blocks

PITTSBURGH, June 11.—A score of firemen are believed to be fighting a terrific battle with the Lawrenceville gas plant, a crude refining concern, a tank, burning for several hours, hurling the contents into the air for a distance of two blocks. Two men were killed and a general fire started, bringing out a fire apparatus in the city. The fire is believed to be spreading. The oil were blown up in flames over the entire city. The fire started late yesterday evening struck one man and seven firemen are known to be killed so far.

Ambulances Are Called
PITTSBURGH, June 11.—A score of city firemen were at the Atlantic Refining Co. storage yards today fighting a tank, burning since yesterday afternoon. The explosion following the explosion of the tank showered the city with an era of two square blocks. Ambulances in the city were called to the scene.
