ROAD CREW WILL LEAVE TUESDAY

A road crew consisting of eight men will leave Roseburg for Diamond Lake next Tuesday. The crew is being formed by Deputy Forest Supervisor George Bonebrake, who is in charge of improvement work and will be employed on the Diamond Lake-Hig Canyon section of the North Empress road. A crew of sixteen men has already been stationed at the lake and camp has been established and the work of slashing brush and grading the right of way has already been started. The work is being done under the direction of E. H. Lough of this city, who has been named as foreman. With the large crew it is anticipated that the work will be completed during the brief summer season.
