CRACK RIFLEMEN TO MATCH SKILL

Premier Shots of the Country to Meet at Camp Perry on September 1 to Participate in National Shoot

CAMP PERRY, Ohio, July 20.—Not less than two thousand American riflemen, in addition to selected shooters from Europe and South America, are expected to take part in the rifle competition here from September 1 to September 27. The international rifle matches will be held here at the same time the national championships are conducted. This is the first time the United States will have conducted the matches since 1913.

Last year the United States government did not appropriate sufficient funds to bring a national guard team from every state, besides teams from every branch of the service. It is unlikely that there will be funds to bring civilian teams to the matches, but this, it is probable, will be taken care of by individual clubs.

The National Rifle association is encouraging the idea of each city defraying the expenses of its best rifle shot. The expense will be transportation to and from Camp Perry and maintenance while at the camp. The

government provides everything else. Major L. W. T. Waller, of the marines, who successfully piloted the United States international rifle team to the world's championship in Milan, Italy, last year, has been designated as captain of the 1923 United States rifle team.

Announcement is made at this time also that Walter Stokes, a student at George Washington university, Washington, D. C., will retain his place on the United States rifle team because of his being the world's champion rifle shot. Stokes won this honor at Milan last year and at Lyons, France, the year before. No shooter ever before won the international championship with the rifle in two years in succession.

The other places on the United States team are open for competition, and trophies will be held at the ranges of the United States government in various sections of the country between August 1 and 15. The distance will be 300 metres, prone, kneeling and standing. It is a five-man team, with several alternates.

In conjunction with the international rifle championships, the Palma matches will be revived. This is the world's long-range championship.
