Oregon is foremost in the milk production per cow of any western state increasing 17.2 per cent from 1919 to 1920. The same period Idaho increased 15.3, Washington 15.2, and California 9.1 per cent, says P. M. Brandt, chief of dairying at O. A. C.

pure bred bulls in 1920 according to the 14th census, having 48.8 per cent while Washington had 41, California 39, and Idaho 34 per cent. The same census shows that for every pure bred bull in Oregon there are 61 cows, while Washington has 70, California 99, and Idaho 103.
