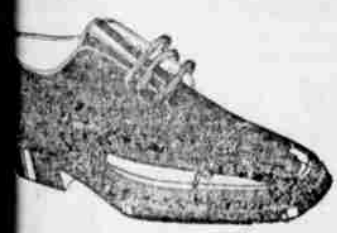

WANT CALIFORNIA TO PAVE HIGHWAY

Portland Chamber Asks Oregon Organizations to Use Influence

IGNORANCE EXPRESSED

California Highway Engineer Doesn't Even Know Where Highway Is Located—Try to Bottle Up Tourists

California apparently is seeking to bottle up the tourists which go to that state, and prevent them from learning of the wonders of the Pacific highway, according to a letter received by the local Chamber of Commerce from the Portland chamber. The paving of the Pacific Highway through Washington and Oregon is now nearly completed and from Canada to the Mexican border the only unpaved portion, except for short stretches, is in the northern part of California. So far, however, California has made no effort to connect up and apparently is endeavoring to hide behind a cloak of ignorance and make it appear that she does not know of the improvements made by other states. A letter which explains the situation, asks for the cooperation of the Roseburg Chamber of Commerce and other organizations in an effort to bring about the paving of the California portion of the highway. The letter in part follows:

"The paving of the Pacific Highway from the state of Washington to the Oregon line is completed with the exception of about nine miles from Albany to Corvallis, which is a high class, hard surfaced road. In the state of Washington from the British Columbia line to the Oregon state line, the highway will be virtually completely paved, and in use, on October 15th of this year.

"Inquiries have been made from Mr. R. M. Morton, state highway engineer of California as to what program the state of California has for paving the stretch on the Pacific highway in California south of the Oregon line. We understand, that he replied that he did not know what was meant by the Pacific highway but 'presumed it was from San Francisco to the Oregon line, known in California as the Redwood highway,' which of course it is not.

"Some two years ago this chamber had a lot of correspondence on the same subject on account of the statement made by Mr. Fletcher, then highway engineer, that so far as he—Mr. Fletcher—was concerned, he did not expect to see the Pacific highway in California completed in his life time but the connecting link from the California system to the Oregon system would be by Crescent City. As a matter of fact, he continued he wasn't very well acquainted with the Pacific highway route.

"This matter was then taken up by this chamber with the various cities along the route. These communities took the matter up with the state highway commission of California and received a reply which cleared up the situation at that time and the chairman of the Oregon highway commission wrote the California commission expressing his gratification that the matter was to be cleared up.

"We are faced now with almost an identical, similar condition. The present highway engineer of California 'does not know where the Pacific highway is.' If so, it is difficult for us to understand how the commission can have any policy for completing California's share of the Pacific highway so that it may be paved from end to end.

"We believe that the paving of the Pacific highway is of vital necessity to every point along the highway and equally to the states of California, Oregon and Washington, and also to our neighboring province of British Columbia, not only from a tourist standpoint but in the interest of commerce and general business.

"California has a reputation for having good roads and has had that reputation for some years but it seems to be rather a misnomer that the only section of the Pacific highway that is unpaved or will be unpaved within a couple of months, and which is in very bad condition, is a large stretch of road in the state of California.

"Oregon, of course, cannot tell the people of California what they should do but we can point out to them that it is not to their interest, either as a matter of publicity or as a matter of dollars and cents, that throughout America it should be known that the state is lax in carrying on a public improvement which is for the benefit of the whole coast, especially since the states of Oregon and Washington with very much smaller populations, have completed their improvement.

"The Pacific highway now has the longest stretch of pavement of any highway in the world and for its scenic attractions throughout its entire length has absolutely no rival. It is a national attraction of the greatest magnitude and its only drawback is this unpaved section in the state of California."
