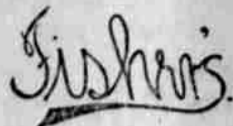

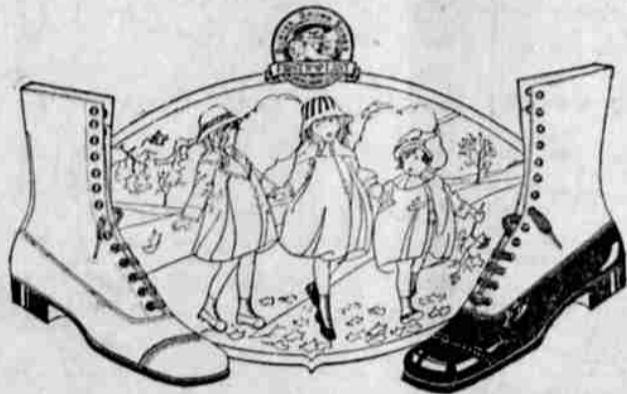

REV. NEEDHAM TO GO TO MEDFORD

Rev. J. B. Needham, pastor of the M. E. Church, South, has been transferred to Medford and Rev. Stewart Odell has been assigned to the Roseburg church, according to word from Milton, Oregon, where the northwest conference has been in session for the past few days. The fact that Rev. Needham is to leave this city will bring great regret to his many friends here. During the time spent in Roseburg he has made a great many friends, not only among members of his church, but everywhere he has gone, and it was hoped that the conference would see fit to send him back to this church again. During the

time he has been pastor of the local church it has made rapid progress and it was during his pastorate that the fine new building now occupied by the congregation was constructed. The conference also announced the appointment of Eustace Anderson to the church at Myrtle Creek. J. C. Jones is to remain as presiding elder of the Portland district. C. A. Rexroad, a former pastor of the local church, has been assigned to Corbin Park church in Spokane.

POSTAL OFFICE AT CANYONVILLE CLOSED

The Postal telegraph office at Canyonville has been closed after being in existence for nearly forty years with but one change in managers.

G. O. McGilvray, who has been in the service of the company for many years, tendered his resignation recently with the result that the company has declared the office closed for the present time. The office was established Aug. 2, 1886, and was placed under the management of Marcellus Colvig. Mr. Colvig served until his death, June 17, 1906. G. O. McGilvray who had been in the employ of the company for over three years, was then appointed and served until September 4 of this year, when his resignation was forwarded. Mr. McGilvray, the retiring manager, took up telegraphing in Wisconsin in 1871. He was an operator for the Western Union for a number of years and then went to the Mutual Union, which company built a line from New York to Minneapolis. In 1878 he went back to the Western Union for three years and in 1883 was employed by the C. B. & Q. company when they built up the Mississippi from Gallsburg, Illinois, to St. Paul.
