



### MANY INCOME TAX RETURNS IN ERROR

PORTLAND. Oct. 15.—Investigations conducted by field deputies of the internal revenue service indicate that hundreds of taxpayers in Oregon have neglected, intentionally or otherwise, to include as income in their returns for 1929, 1921 and 1922 profits realized from the sale of real estate, according to Collector Huntley, who several weeks ago ordered a rigid probe to be made of suspected evasions of income regulations.

In order to close up the government fax net, the collector has ordered that at transcript be made of all doubtful transfers. A careful investigation will be made of all these files, to determine whether or not the sales involved have been reported upon the income tax returns. Collector Huntley suggested that all receives
