LOCAL GIRL KNOWS ALLEGED BANDITS

Clerk in Confectionery Says That She Corresponded with Roy D'Autremont Until Last May—Letters Returned Then

Dorothy Wiberg, a clerk in a Sheridan street confectionery, is well acquainted with the D'Autremont brothers, who are being sought by officers upon the belief that they are the bandits who held up train number 13 and killed the members of the train crew. Miss Wiberg and her brother Edwin Wiberg, 19 year old high school youth at Albany, have both been interviewed by the officers and have expressed a willingness to help in every way they can. Miss Wiberg says that she knew Roy D'Autremont quite well and corresponded with him over a period of several months. After coming to Roseburg, where she has been residing with a married sister, she visited her on one or two occasions.

She discontinued their correspondence, however, last May and returned all of the letters he had written her. She did not state the reason for quitting correspondence with him but says that she has not heard from him since last May. Her brother was better acquainted with the boys than herself and he has been helping the officers all that he could. She has been questioned by S. P. officials on several occasions and has willingly told all that she knew, but was unable to give them any information which would be of assistance in locating the D'Autremont boys as she has not heard from them since spring.

West coast sawmills report out last week 27 per cent above normal.

Salem—Valuation of utilities for taxation increased \$41,000,000.

Stayton promoting 1-mile paving. Grants Pass—\$157,000 to be expended on Redwood highway.

Bend—Rich gold strike causing stampede to Pueblo mountain. Chas. K. Crandall has become owner of Malheur Enterprise.

Bend—Shively-Hixon sawmill building \$3,000 men's club house. Baker—Gypsum deposits and plant on Snake river near here sold. Plant to be enlarged.

Freewater—Ten carloads sheep shipped to Chicago from this point. Baker—Plans maturing for 1924 county fair at this point.

Portland—Local Pacific Tel. & Tel. Co. switches 2900 more telephones over to automatic system.

Albany—Road connecting Detroit and Niagara to start this fall. Oregon City—Six districts to have union high school at Oakley Hill.

Springfield—Work starts on Booth-Kelley coffer dam. Dallas lets \$45,000 storm and sanitary sewer contracts.

Wheeler lumber and shingle mill resumes operations. Eugene—New Mapleton-Cushman highway almost finished.

Elgin expects box factory to reopen in short time. Reedsport C. MacC. Johnson mill making improvements to increase capacity 25 per cent.

Albany—Albany college starts \$600,000 campaign. Dallas to have new high school.

Reedsport—S. Pac. plans \$30,000 passenger depot and freight house here. Astoria—Work underway on \$75,000 apartment house.

Brownsville to rebuild water system. Yoncalla installing new water mains. Portland grants \$200,000 permit for construction new truck terminal.

Grants Pass plans addition to high school. Gaston paves main street. Marion county paved 25 miles this year.

Portland—Apple exports from this port expected to reach 1,000,000 boxes this year. Roseburg to get new \$50,000 hotel.

Eugene—Baptists contemplate erection of \$150,000 edifice. Portland—From Aug. 1 to Oct. 10, 2812 cars grain unloaded for export.

Salem proposes new high school on Capitol street. Marshfield moved 27 building permits during September.

COPCO TAX RAISE BRINGS PROTEST

MEDFORD, Oct. 23.—The California Oregon Power company has filed a formal protest against the action of the Oregon state tax commissioner in raising the assessments of utility companies throughout the state. A hearing has been set for October 29, and pending the outcome of the hearing, development under way by the power company in Klamath county is being held up.

The power concern sets forth in its protest that the total increase is approximately 80 per cent over last year and amounts in money from \$1,250,000 in 1922 to \$2,125,000 this year.

The company asks that the assessment be fixed at approximately \$1,800,000, about \$300,000 less than that placed by the tax commissioner, and resulting in a 50 or 60 per cent increase.

The utility company also sets forth that it is willing to pay its fair share of taxes, but does not care to be overburdened.

ANCIENT OMEN FORECASTS BLOODSHED IN EUROPE

GENEVA, Oct. 22.—(A. P.)—The "blood of the Burgundians" has appeared again on the water of Lake Morat, near Neuchatel, portending more trouble for old Europe, if ancient legend is to be believed.

The reddening of the water of this lake is caused by the flowering of an aquatic plant, which, however, blooms very rarely. The phenomenon was seen in 1476, when 26,000 Burgundians under Charles the Bold were defeated near the lake by the Swiss. The last time the waters were red was in 1914, just before the outbreak of the world war, a circumstance said to justify the old saying, "When blood is seen on Lake Morat there will be bloodshed in Europe."
