The purposes of the association as set forth in the constitution and by-laws are: "To improve conditions of the community by building community spirit, giving entertainment, improving school rooms and school grounds, and the character and ability of the pupils."

The first project taken up by the association is the securing of better reading matter in every home. Their first work is taking subscriptions for

"The Country Gentleman" through the Curtis Publishing company. The school receives one-half of the subscription money.

The monthly meeting of the Parent-Teachers' association was held Friday evening. The following program was rendered: Community singing by Mrs. Goff, Mrs. Isom at piano; recitation, Earl Oakley, "She's Your Mother;" vocal duet, Mr. Slocum and Mrs. Isom; illustrated lecture, "Schools and their work from Colonial times to the present," slides furnished by the University of Oregon. This lecture and pictures showed the neglected and unimportant place of education in the old time rural communities, the long and tedious work that it has been to overcome these unfavorable conditions and impressions to bring about the modern up-to-date consolidated school.

The membership campaign that was started at the October meeting was terminated on Friday night, the

results showing a total of 78 members. It was shown that neither side had won in the contest, each having 35 members, therefore the refreshments will be served jointly.

The editorial on Parent-Teachers' associations in the News-Review of November 2nd was read and a vote of thanks was offered to the editor for his loyal support of this worthy cause. The majority of the people of today favor a decided change in the news material of the public press. Attractive headlines for great achievements and good work with minor importance given to crime and disaster surly would have a more favorable impression on the reader.

The hot lunch service of the school sponsored by the P. T. A. is being carried on again under the direction of Mrs. Harry Oakley. At the meeting Friday night the children present voluntarily gave a vote of thanks for this work.

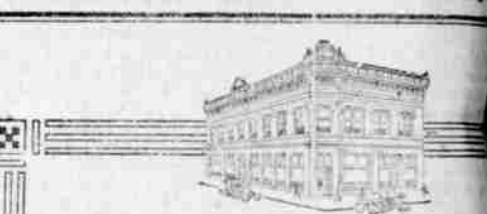
