Transposing words and phrases, Roper's logic as pointed out to his more intellectually alert young athletes was what a tight manager might say to a boxer who "didn't have much." "You're game, and that's half the fight. You go in there and stay in there and when that kid misses you, clip him on the jaw. Clip him every time he misses and we'll win. If you

R. Dodson, to the defendant. The letter read as follows: "Whether in the gray of early dawn or in the splendor of a noonday sun, or in the fast-fading twilight, or in the gloomy depths of darkest night, whenever I think of you, I have these words in my heart. I love thee, wherever thou art. (Signed) 'HOT DOG DODSON.'" Dodson, as state bank examiner, was a witness for the state, and the letter was read in cross examination with the question if he was the author.
