

## TESTS BEING MADE ON CRANBERRIES

ASTORIA, Ore., Nov. 11.—Samuel Bain from the United States Department of Agriculture is here to investigate the cranberry disease now prevalent on the Pacific coast. He will ship a shipment of fifty-five boxes of berries to the Portland market.

These berries are picked from various marshes under varied conditions. A complete growing record for each box has been kept for each box in the lot.

The purpose of shipping the berries to Portland is to have the berries just as the cranberry growers are handling them.

This is the second season of investigations of this kind. Last year negotiations were in the hands of the market. The results of the investigation is according to Schimpp, sales manager of the Cranberry Exchange, impossible for the good house-keeper by Pacific coast last year.
