R. H. MAYNARD TO BUILD SAW MILL

R. H. Maynard, who formerly operated a sawmill at the Curve estate near Brown's bridge, later moving the mill to Cascade, where he sold his interests, has secured about \$6,000,000 worth of blue oak timber on Rose creek, four miles from Cascade, and will erect a mill at once. Mr. Maynard, who is a veteran sawmill man, has ordered a new mill from Portland and expects to have the plant in operation shortly after the first of the year. It is stated that the plant will have a capacity of approximately 15,000 feet daily. The mill will be operated by steam, and the short haul to railway makes marketing of the product of the mill an easy matter.

JURY HEARS SUIT ON PROMISSORY NOTE

The suit of L. W. Robison against J. H. Hawley was heard in the circuit court today. The suit is one in which Robison is suing on a promissory note given by Hawley in payment of a claim for money. Hawley, one of the owners of the Elk Creek mill.
