9,000 FORD SALES AGENCIES IN U. S.

DETROIT, Mich., Dec. 5.—Extension of the Ford Motor company's sales and service organization during the year has been rather remarkable and is due, of course, to the continually increasing demand for Ford products. There have been 432 new dealers appointed since January 1, bringing the total number of authorized dealers in the United States up to 9,448 the greatest retail sales organization ever known. At present the Ford service stations total around 22,000. In foreign countries there are 3,800 authorized Ford dealers and 7,000 service stations.
