**DR. STEWART HEAD OF LEGION POST**  
Dr. E. B. Stewart was elected last night as the commander of Umpqua Post of the American Legion. During the past year Dr. Stewart has carried on a work which has put the Roseburg post foremost in the state and he was unanimously chosen to head the organization for another year. V. M. Petterson was elected first vice commander; R. C. Blackall, second vice commander; L. E. McClintock, adjutant; James Fletcher, Jr., historian; Harry Booth, finance officer; Andrew O. Dodge, chaplain; Carl E. Wimberly, Ted Post and Bert G. Bates, executive committee, and Herbert Quine, sergeant-at-arms.

The meeting was well attended and very enthusiastic. The post voted to purchase 1000 books on flag etiquette and place in all of the schools and reading rooms of the county.

Rudolph Blizman and Clinton Gorthy were appointed captains of rival teams to conduct the membership campaign. Roseburg Post is now leading in the state in paid up memberships for 1924, and at the present time has more veterans signed up for next year than any other post in Oregon, including the Portland post.
