HOP HEAD OF EXPERIENCE

Young Man Who Took "Kick-Off" Cure in Coos County Jail Arrives Home

TO GIVE TALK

Had Been Jabbing His Arms for 20 Years Was Placed in Jail Until Habit Lost

After having been a vicious dope habit for 20 years, Robert E. Jones, who returned to Coos county today from the States, has proven that a man can cure himself of a dope habit without medical treatment. Jones, who took the "kick-off" cure in Coos county jail about 100 days ago, walked into the States office this morning and in a long talk told a very interesting story of his life as an addict, during which he visited every den of iniquity and worlds of the western world. He is to give a talk tonight at the Coos county armory, 7 o'clock, as a "hop head" and he expects a large audience. He will give a message of cheer to those who are in the clutches of the terrible habit. For twenty years, Jones has been in every sort of "junk" hospital, but he decided to attempt to cure himself. His success, after 100 days, proves that addicts can cure themselves if they can stand the pain enough will power to stand it.

Jones was placed in the Coos county jail upon his own request, he might fight the habit. He was released December 1st as a condition of his parole, but he committed suicide before he was shot," he declared. "The Coos county jail was hell, and but for the fact that I would have committed suicide I had suffered until I was almost dead for four days. I started with a bottle of iodine, such as is used for disinfecting and suffering I was cured."

Jones was first hooked on dope at Bend, where representing the phone as a doctor, he worked at the Keiser hospital for a while, then at the Mercy hospital for a while, and then at Smedberg for six months. He was given more dope than he could use, and he was told that if he would either cure himself or die in the attempt, he would be released. He traveled all over the world and has recently returned from Europe, where he was given morphine for a number of years, plenty of it.

Looking to be cured, Jones states he was hooked on dope at Bend, where he was addicted to the habit for 20 years, starting the habit at the age of 18. To get the dope, his mother was put into a hospital and he did not become an addict until he was 20. Mr. Jones' arms and legs are literally pained, and he has taken shots, and many times a doctor has said that he was almost dead, were dope fiends, and his mother and sister, he said, were hop heads. He does not use dope any more.

"Dr. Keiser told me that I would die first before I could be cured by the 'kick-off method' and that is what I thought," Jones said. "But I heard that the Chief of Police Jackson had been put in jail. Dr. Keiser offered me the cure, but I told him that I would not take any medical cure, that I would cure myself with dope and poison into my veins. I called the officer, who said that I would not cure myself and that I would die first without the cure."

"From there I was taken to the Coos county jail where I spent 100 days of hell. The suffering was unbearable. I chewed at the walls, I hit my head, I kicked the walls, I did nothing, but I didn't want any more dope. On the fourth day I decided to quit the fight and I drank a bottle of iodine which my mate knocked it from my hand. I was desperate but from that time on I was quiet down. I tried to get the subject off my mind. That is the way to fight it. You must do other things. Imagination is the greatest thing you can use to get a dope habit out of your system. Imagination is the greatest thing you can use to get out of dope."

"A dope fiend will do anything to get the dope when the habit is strong. I have even cooked meat and eaten it, and I have jabbed the juice into my veins. When I got a kick out of it I was quiet down. I have used every kind of dope, sniffed heroin, smoked opium, used cocaine and other things, but I could bring the desired result. I have done this for 20 years."

Mr. Jones tells his story in a sincere manner, saying that he hopes others could gain strength from his experience to conquer the habit. He says that the "junk" is easy to get and that it is easy to get rid of by associating with his kind of people. He says that he has seen many of the upper classes of society who have been ruined by the habit. He relates some interesting incidents in the Chinatown of San Francisco and of the underworld of the cities.
