MAY JOIN FRUIT AND CANNERY INTERESTS

A number of the fresh fruit growers of the county met yesterday to consider the organization of a county association of growers to take the place of the Oregon Growers Cooperative association. The growers were unanimously in favor of some sort of an organization but there was considerable discussion as to the form this association should take. The plan which met with the most favor provides for a fusion of the fresh fruit and cannery interest. The growers would unite with the cannery company and form a cooperative concern similar to that now operating with much success at Eugene. As the plan presented was only tentative in form and obviously presenting many complications, it was decided to leave further consideration to a committee which will meet with the cannery board and see if some proposition can be worked out. The committee is composed of R. W. Hinkley, chairman; R. S. Hutton, C. H. Bailey, O. G. Rogers, Arthur Marsh and R. A. Busenbark.

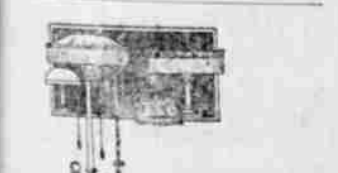

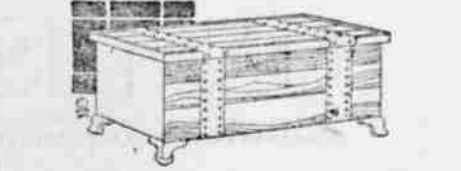

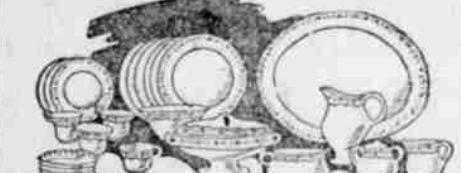
