PRIVATE HOME IS RAIDED BY SLEUTH'S

PORTLAND, Jan. 2.—As a result of a raid by state prohibition agents on a private social function at his home 1915 Quimby street, shortly before midnight Monday, A. G. Labbe, prominent citizen of Portland and head of the Willamette Iron & Steel works, was arrested, taken to the county jail and forced to deposit \$500 bail on charges of violating the prohibition law.

Accounts as to the amount of liquor found varied. Mr. Labbe and his guests said that nothing was found but a small flask, carried into the house by one of the guests. State prohibition Commissioner Cleaver, in a formal typewritten statement gave the impression that there was a considerable supply.

About 80 persons, all prominent in the social, political, financial, business and professional life of the city, were guests at the function. Vigorous complaints that the raid was unjustified and conducted solely for theatrical effect were made.

Five state agents conducted the raid, one of whom, a man named McMillan, was identified by guests as a person who has recently completed a term in the Clackamas county jail and who has been recently arrested for felony at Astoria. Commissioner Cleaver's young son was also recognized as one of the raiding party.

Information that led to the raid was received by Cleaver in the form of an anonymous letter, to which the writer had not even signed his or her name. On this anonymous tip the search warrant that led to the raid was obtained.

RAILROAD ALMOST ON AUCTION BLOCK

DENVER, Jan. 2.—The Denver & Rio Grande Western railway, now under federal receivership, was saved from possible sale on the auction block for a second time when United States District Judge J. Foster Symes today signed an order permitting Receiver Thomas H. Beason to borrow \$1,500,000 to be used in paying \$1,290,000 in interest on underlying bonds of \$1,000,000, the interest having fallen due yesterday.

To Raise Interest Money.
