1924 WILL BE A POLITICAL YEAR

Voters to Be Kept Busy
Studying Political Measures During Entire Year.

TO ELECT SENATORS

Ports and Districts to Nominate and Elect Officers at Primary and Regular Elections.

PORTLAND, Jan. 12.—Political matters will be much in the public mind during 1924. Throughout the 12 months there will be something doing in a political way, and then politics will overflow into 1925 for three months or so. The voters of Oregon might as well be prepared to do their duty, for they will have enough to engross their attention.

This is a presidential year, but it has much local interest as well. There will be the primaries and the general election in the fall and—who knows?—an election aimed to recall Governor Pieren.

Special Measures Coming
With national, state, county and municipal offices to vote on, and a few special measures which are to go on the ballot to mend the constitution, the year will be replete with matters political, and campaigns of all sorts are impending. In May will be the presidential preferential primaries. So far as known, Coolidge, Johnson and La Follette will be the only names on the republican ballot, and McAdoo is the only one in prospect on the democratic ballot. At the same time the two parties will elect delegates to the national conventions, and there will be selected the republican and democratic presidential electors.

Senatorial Entries Listed

Nominations for United States senator will also be made in the primaries. For the republican honor there are now in the field C. L. McNary, George L. Baker and K. K. Kibbi. Democratic aspirants are Will R. King, Milton A. Miller, George Mansfield and William H. Strayer. The list is not closed and others may come later. Nominations will also be made for representative in the three congressional districts. Among state officers to be nominated are the secretary of state, attorney general, state dairy and food commissioner and two members of the public service commission, the terms of H. F. Corey and Newton McCoy expiring in 1925.

Throughout the state there will be half a dozen circuit judges to nominate and 32 district attorneys. There will also be nominated 16 county judges, 36 county commissioners, 35 sheriffs, 24 county treasurers, six county recorders, 36 county school superintendents, 21 county surveyors and 24 coroners.

Commissions to Be Changed

Many changes will occur in the various port commissions. There will be two places to fill on the Port of Astoria, two at Astoria, two at Bandon, three at Bay City, three at Coos Bay, two at Coquille and two at Nehalem; three at Newport, five at Portland, one at Port Orford, three at Siuslaw, two at Toledo and three at Umpqua.

The voters must nominate and elect 15 state senators and 49 representatives.

When the selections have been made in the primaries, the general election in November will determine the result, from president down to coroner. Nor will politics end then. With the election of the legislative members there will be the skirmishing for organization, which will fill up the time until January, when the session is assembled, and the session itself will run up almost to March, and in March there is the inauguration of the president of the United States which will be followed by applications for places at the pie counter.

It looks as though politics will be one of the leading industries in Oregon in 1924.
