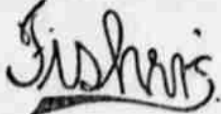

MABEL NORMAND TESTIFIES TODAY

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) LOS ANGELES, Jan. 21.—Mabel Normand, film actress, fashionably clad and looking none the worse for her recent operation for appendicitis, today failed to identify the 25-calibre pistol, up to the present time believed to have been hers, with which Horace A. Greer, Miss Normand's chauffeur, shot Courtland S. Dines, Denver oil man, New Year's night. Miss Normand was 45 minutes on the stand at Greer's hearing today.

For the second time Mrs. Edith Barnes, heretofore described as Miss Normand's housekeeper at the time the shooting occurred, failed to appear in court as a witness in the hearing and a bench warrant was issued for her arrest.

Shortly after the conclusion of Miss Normand's testimony the hearing adjourned until 2 o'clock.

Miss Normand grew quite nervous during the cross examination. The defense interrupted Miss Normand's testimony with violent objections but the actress kept talking. The defense shouted to her to await court instructions. "I have to tell the truth," she said. The audience applauded. Justice Hauby rapped for quiet and threatened to "clear out the entire bench."
