POINCARÉ AND DEPUTIES MIX

Financial Program Causes Debate and Premier Receives Complaint.

SOLUTION IMPOSSIBLE

May Use Methods Similar to Ones Employed by Premier Mussolini in Italy—Debate Heated.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) PARIS, Jan. 25.—Premier Poincaré and the chamber of deputies came to grips today in the debate on the financial program.

Many of the deputies complain with increased frankness at what they consider the curtness and contrariness with which the premier is demanding a vote on the taxation proposals.

On the other hand there is a growing element in parliament that fears a solution of the fiscal situation is almost impossible without the use of methods similar to those employed by Premier Mussolini in Italy.

Deputy La Cotte, the first speaker in today's debate, said the salvation of the franc depended upon the friendship of the United States, adding that the foreign policy of France was inadequate to bring out the advantages that friendship might afford. For instance, he said, it was a great error for France to treat her debts to Great Britain and the United States on the same footing.

"The United States," he continued, "came to help France through pure idealism, while France and Great Britain were partners associated in a way that justifies France in considering that her debt to Britain is subject to condition."

Louis DuBois, ex-president of the repatriation commission read a declaration on behalf of the blue national the strongest group in the chamber, approving the financial proposals of the government.
