DISSATISFACTION IN VETERAN'S BUREAU

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
WASHINGTON, Feb. 1.—Dissatisfaction with what is described as the failure of Director Hines to "clean house" in the veterans' bureau on the basis of disclosures in the nine months of senate investigation has arisen in the special senate veterans' committee.

Senator Oddie, republican, Nevada, one of the members of the committee, declared in a statement today that he was "thoroughly dissatisfied and provoked because the very necessary changes that should have been made in the personnel of the veterans' bureau have not been made."

"As a result," he said "there has not been the improvement in the handling of individual cases that there should have been. Continued

injustice to a large number of former service men naturally has followed."
