### INCOME TAX REPORTS DUE BEFORE MARCH 15

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 21.—  
Changes wrought by births, deaths  
and marriages during the last year af-  
fect materially federal income tax re-  
turns for the year 1923, according to  
Clyde C. Huntley, collector of internal  
revenue. Millions of babies were ad-  
ded to family circles. For each, the  
parents, in addition to the personal  
exemptions allowed married couples,  
are entitled to a \$100 credit for a de-  
pendent.

Boys and girls who became self-  
supporting, and whose parents allow them  
the use of their earnings without re-  
striction, form a new class of taxpay-  
ers. Each must file an income tax re-  
turn and pay a tax on his or her net  
income, if such income was in excess  
of \$1,000. The earnings of dependent  
minor children who have not been  
"emancipated"—allowed the use of  
their earnings by their parents must  
be included in the parents' return of  
income.

### RECRUITING OFFICER COMING.

Sergeant Grover C. Owens, from  
the regular army recruiting office,  
Medford, will be in Roseburg on re-  
cruiting duty from February 23 to 25  
inclusive. Sergeant Owens is author-  
ized to make enlistments for practi-  
cally any camp or station on the At-  
lantic or Pacific coasts, Mexican bor-  
der, Philippine islands, Hawaii or  
Panama. The sergeant is making spe-  
cial effort to secure men for the 16th  
infantry, which is stationed at Gov-  
ernor's Island, Statue of Liberty and  
Fort Wadsworth, all in New York  
harbor. Five cents car fare from any  
of the stations to 42nd street and  
Broadway, New York City. The 16th  
infantry was the first regiment of in-  
fantry to go to France during the  
world war and the last to return.

Men enlisting for the 16th infantry  
and other organizations on the At-  
lantic coast, will be sent from San  
Francisco, California, by transport  
through the Panama canal to New  
York City.

survey, and must be filed within 90  
days thereafter.
