WOUNDED VETERAN HELPED

SPokane, Wash., Feb. 21.—The red tape of the Veterans' Bureau was quickly cut here by the American Legion, when that organization afforded relief to C. W. Hoffman, a wounded veteran, who has made futile attempts to secure compensation from the government.

Hoffman's plight was revealed in a recent issue of a Spokane newspaper, and within half an hour after appearance of the article, funds and supplies were made available to the man's family by the Legion. The veteran was blinded in one eye by gas, received shrapnel wounds in his left leg and arm and was unable to follow his trade. For five years he had been unable to get any help from the Veterans' Bureau. When his wife applied to a city charitable organization for fuel to keep her and her two children warm, the case was made public.
