YONGALLA PLACES BAN ON DANCING

At the request of more than forty residents of Yongalla, the city council of that place, in a special session last night, adopted an ordinance requiring a license of \$20 for all public dances given in the future. This prohibitory license is an effective ban on dancing and resulted from agitation of citizens who have been aroused because of the prevalence of liquor and drunkenness at these events in the past months. At a dance held last Saturday night there was a great deal of drinking and the citizens determined to put an end to future occurrences of this kind, according to a statement made by Deputy Sheriff C. H. Daugherty. A great deal of feeling was aroused over the outcome of the Claude Wise case, in which the defendant was acquitted in the circuit court of the charge of possession of intoxicating liquor. Ted Francis, deputy city marshal, who testified for Wise, was dismissed by the council.
