KLAN APPROVES SCHOOL BUILDING

Gives School Board Assurance
That Organization
Is Behind Efforts.

ACTION IS URGED

Members of Klan Feel That
New Building Necessary
and Urge That Plans
Be Rushed.

The following resolution, apparently passed by Umpqua Klan, number 5, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, was received today by the school board:

"Whereas, it has come to the attention of Umpqua Klan, No. 5 that the city of Roseburg is in immediate need of more school facilities due to the present congestion and the contemplated future growth based on the past yearly increases, also the putting into effect of the Oregon School Amendment the fall of 1926, and,

"Whereas, the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan realize that Americanism can best be promulgated through efficient free public schools, therefore,

"Be it resolved, that Umpqua Klan, No. 5, of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan express by this resolution an appreciation of the efforts of the school board of Roseburg, and we hereby assure them of active cooperation and support in any decisions they may make to advance public schools,

"We urge that a modern fire-proof structure be built as near a central location as possible to relieve the Rose, Benson and high schools and afford a school easily accessible to the greatest number. We frown upon temporary fire-trap buildings that endanger the lives of a future generation except, in cases of emergency until proper facilities can be arranged for at once. Too much cannot be done for the education of our children and a structure that will meet the present and the future requirements from all angles, both as to study and recreation, should be carefully planned and rushed to completion, at once.

"Read and passed in regular Klunklave assembly by a rising unanimous vote.

For the past two years there has been considerable agitation relative to the construction of a new school building. All of the grades are crowded to capacity and the high school has too many pupils for the room available. The school board for some time has been considering the matter of constructing a new building, and the general plan is a junior high school, centrally located, to take care of the pupils from the three higher grades in the grade schools and the freshman class of the high school. Another proposition is to build a new high school building, and to use the present building for junior high school purposes.

The board is endeavoring to arrange for a survey of the city by an expert, who can give the board some advice based upon experience so that the question can be settled in the proper manner. If this survey is not too costly, it will probably be made in the near future, after which the board will lay the matter of a new school building before the voters of the city.
