BURGLAR ALARM CALLS A POSSE

(Associated Press I-ased Wire.)
ALBANY, Ore., March 1.—A
posse of 12 men at Peoria surround-
ed the Lamar and Lamar store last
night and captured Stanley Thomp-
son of Coquille, and Warren Wil-
son of Coquille, both about 25.
The officers reported were found in
the building. Officers said the men
had four automobile tires in their
possession when caught.
In their car, left in front of the
store, officers declared they found
automobile accessories and other ar-
ticles said to have been taken from
the store at Tangent. Both men
are in the Linn county jail here.

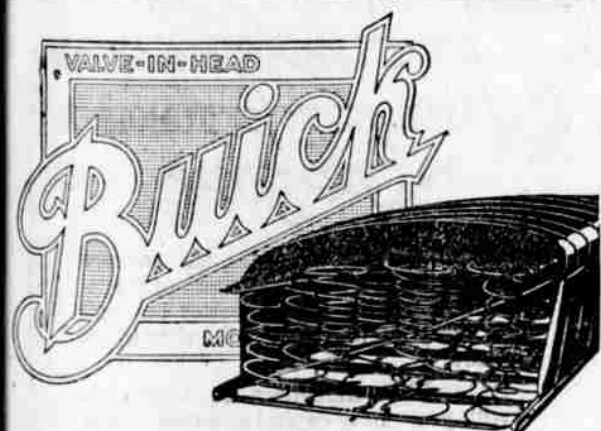
EFFORT BEING MADE TO HALT SMUGGLING

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
WASHINGTON, March 1.—In an
effort to curb smuggling and check
traffic contraband, Assistant Secre-
tary Moss of the treasury has or-
dered customs lines closed at nine
o'clock each night at Tijuana and
Mexicali on the southern California
border. Hereafter business can be
transacted across the border only
from seven a. m. to nine p. m. The
order is effective three days after
its receipt by the customs collector
at Los Angeles.
Assistant Secretary Moss said that
representations made to the customs
authorities indicated a serious con-
dition resulting from the wide open
operation of resorts in Mexicali and
Tijuana.
