(Associated Press Leased Wire.) NEW YORK, March 7.—Corliss Palmer, former cigar store counter attendant, who won a beauty prize and the affections of Eugene V. STATE INCOME TAX PAYMENT POUR IN

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) SALEM, March 7.—Out of an estimated \$1,250,000 that will be collected in Oregon from the state income tax, Earl Fisher, state tax commissioner, estimates that \$69,000 has been paid in out of an estimated \$9,000 returns to be filed. The commissioner says that about 15,000 have been received. Of the approximately 15,000 that have been received it is believed about 7,000 are non-taxable and about 8,000 taxable. The first payments to be received are mainly from persons who pay light income taxes, and the heavier amounts are expected to come later. Mr. Fisher believes about 8,000 or more persons will pay the state income tax than the federal income tax in Oregon. These will be mainly state, county, city and other municipal employees, teachers and other persons who do not pay the federal tax. Returns are delinquent after March 31.
