**VERDICT JONES CASE**

Verdict of guilty as charged returned yesterday in the case against Wayne E. Jones, and a fine of \$50 and costs was assessed by Justice Jones, in a trial of the case heard in the justice court. Jones was charged with having fish in his possession which were claimed too small to come under the law. He was represented by Attorney Elbert Hermann, with District Attorney Guy Cordon appearing for the state. Heated arguments were presented by both defense and prosecution and the case given to the decision of the jury composed of John Botcher, J. W. Stoops, L. R. Mynatt, Mrs. Charlotte Morgan, E. M. Cole and H. M. Boy. Upon the returning of the verdict counsel for the defense announced that the case would be appealed to the circuit court.

**CITIZEN'S CAMP OPENS ON JUNE 19**

Colonel W. Howell, commanding officer of the 7th Infantry and Captain R. O. Foage, also of the 7th Infantry, who inspected the local National Guard unit last night, are working actively for the citizen's military training camp which is to be held at Camp Lewis from June 19 to July 18. The basic course, and Red, White and Blue courses in infantry, cavalry, field artiller, engineers and signal corps, will be provided at Camp Lewis. These courses being based upon the number of times the applicant has attended the camps or the previous military training which he has received.

The objects of these camps are to bring together young men of high type from all sections of the country and thereby develop closer national and social unity; to teach the privileges, duties and responsibilities of American citizenship; to stimulate patriotism; to interest young men in the importance of military training; to teach self-discipline and obedience; and to develop the physical standard of the American youth through participation in military exercises, athletic games and sports, conducted under expert directors.

The basic course is open to all young men between 17 and 24 years, who have the necessary physical qualifications and are possessed with average general intelligence and are able to read and write and who have good moral character. The government provides transportation, meals and all expenses while in camp. The officials in charge of the camp arrange various recreational features including trips to Tacoma and important points in that vicinity. There are sports of all kinds provided, and many young men find the month's training a most enjoyable way to spend the summer's vacation.
