

EDWARDS AGAIN WINS FROM HAND

Superior Weight and Strength Enable the Champion to Retain His Title.

LOSER SHOWS UP WELL

Captures First Fall With Toe Hold, But Succumbs in Next Two to Series of Headlocks.

In a three-fall grappling contest at Cottage Grove Tuesday night with Ralph Hand, the hometown pride, Billy Edwards, the Kansas City 175 pounder, successfully defended the world's light heavyweight championship title which he captured for the second time from Ted Thye at Portland two weeks ago. Though out-weighted ten pounds and handicapped by a severe cold Hand put up a game struggle and won the first fall in 26 minutes. Edwards' superior strength and the use of his deadly headlock proved too much for the smaller man in the next two falls, which were taken by the title holder in 16 and 8 minutes, respectively.

The struggle, in its process, was practically a duplicate of Edwards' previous victory over Hand, registered at Cottage Grove in June of last year. With the same advantage in weight and proportionate advantage in strength, coupled probably with the conviction in which nearly all the spectators shared—that the headlock could make him master of the situation at any time, Edwards distained to use that overpowering hold until it was conclusively demonstrated that he couldn't win the bout by any other method. In the first period Hand broke every body and leg hold which the champion clamped on and, in return, made the bigger man crawl off the mat or grab the ropes repeatedly to escape toe holds to the accompaniment of jeers by the crowd. Finally, after 29 minutes, Hand secured a double toe hold. Edwards struggled in vain for over five minutes to free himself and then pounded the mat in submission.

It was then up to Edwards to preserve his title, and in the next period he wore down Hand rapidly with a succession of headlocks, head scissors and then a leg split that was followed up with a final headlock from which Hand was too weak to extricate himself. The third and deciding fall was won by the champion with another punishing head compressor that stretched Hand on the mat for over a minute after his shoulders were pinned.

In the boxing preliminary, Clarence Reilly kayaked Archie Oliver in a little more than two minutes of fighting in which the defeated novice displayed nothing but a willing spirit and a wide open mark, as against a man of some science and long experience. Oliver was floored twice in the first round, the going saving him in the second at the count of seven. He opened the second round by driving Reilly to the ropes and in return his unguarded chin stopped a short arm jab that sent him to dreamland for many seconds after the fatal 19 was tolled off. This bout was a substitute for the advertised affair between Padoiford and Jacobs, for which arrangements were upset.

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FRENCH FIGURE ON WHAT THEY'LL GET

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

PARIS, April 16.—The French people are beginning to figure what this country may expect to receive under the plan outlined by Brigadier-General Dawes and his associates.

Some profess to find that a settlement on the basis of the plan would give France total payments at present values of less than twenty-one billion gold marks. The opposition to Poincare is taking up these figures and dwelling upon what is called "another amputation of France's claims."

France, under the London schedule of payments would receive 26,000,000,000 gold marks on the first two series of bonds, with a contingent interest in the balance of 60,000,000,000 marks.

Premier Poincare, in a campaign speech last night, said the experts had estimated Germany's capacity to pay for only a few years to come and had not diminished the amount she would be required to pay eventually.

PARIS, April 16.—The German note in reply to the reparations commission's invitation for German representatives to be heard on the expert committee's report was handed to the commission at 6:50 p. m.

PARIS, April 16.—The German reply is an unconditional acceptance of the experts' plans as a basis for negotiations, looking to a final settlement of reparations questions, the German war burdens commission declared.

The text of the German reply, which is extremely brief, was given out tonight. It reads:

"The German government has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of the note of the reparations commission on April 11, confirming the experts' reports. The German government considers the reports offer a practical basis for a speedy solution of the reparations problem. Therefore it declares its willingness to collaborate in execution of the experts' plan."

PARIS, April 16.—The German reply is regarded at the headquarters of the German reparations commission in Paris as an unconditional acceptance of the report.

If any obstacle is put in the way of a reparations settlement now it will be by some other than the German government," it was remarked at the German headquarters this afternoon.

PARIS, April 16.—The German reply to the reparations commission's communication with regard to the experts' report is regarded in reparations commission circles as a real bona fide acceptance of the report as a basis for settlement of the reparations question and as going fully as far as the commission expected.

EVELYN NESBIT WILL TESTIFY AGAINST THAW

PHILADELPHIA, April 16.—Counsel for Harry K. Thaw in his fight to be adjudged sane by a jury in common pleas court, plan to devote today's session to the examination of medical witnesses.

Yesterday Dr. Charles K. Mills, noted alienist, five members of the jury which declared Thaw insane in 1917 and many others testified that they believed him sane. Among them were the three policemen who arrested him following his attempted suicide here in 1917. So far, those opposing the slayer of Stanford White in his fight for freedom have had no opportunity to produce witnesses, the case for the petitioner still being far from complete. Sensations are expected when Evelyn Nesbit, divorced wife of Thaw takes the stand against him.

PHILADELPHIA, April 16.—Expert testimony, averring that Harry K. Thaw is sane, opened the third day of his sanity trial in common pleas court.
