BASEBALL SPORT HAS BIG OPENING

Walter Johnson Celebrates Day By Pitching His 101st Shutout Game.

COOLIDGE PITCHES BALL

Group of Show Girls Supply Color for Opening to Sea- son in New York— Giants Defeated.

NEW YORK, April 16.—America's greatest outdoor spectacle, the 1924 baseball revue, was presented amid typical settings yesterday while nearly a quarter million spectators applauded the efforts of old stars and new.

President Coolidge performed one of the most pleasant duties of the chief executive by "chucking it over the pan" at Washington. He so impressed Walter Johnson that the veteran of the iron arm responded with the best hurling performance of the day. Against Philadelphia he pitched his 101st shutout and increased his string of strike-outs to more than 3,000. The Senators won, 4 to 0.

Kenesaw M. Landis, commissioner of baseball, attending the national league opening at St. Louis, where, in a heavy hitting battle, the home team illustrated the famous phrase "won in the ninth" defeating the Cubs, 6 to 5.

Ban Johnson, president of the American league, sat at Boston where the world's champions proved their steel by winning the hardest fought contest of the day 2 to 1. A group of show girls supplied an appropriate dash of Broadway to the Giant opening at New York, where more than 44,000 people—the largest crowd of the day, saw the maligned Brooklyn Robins defeat the National League champions, in a close game, 3 to 2.

Mayors and dignitaries of other cities tossed baseballs in the general direction of the plate while bands played and crowds that exceeded 25,000 in most places cheered their efforts.

The order is in accordance with the recent supreme court decision giving the commission the power to regulate the deer season. The commission issued a similar order last season but an injunction prevented its enforcement.
