First: By grading said street to the proper sub-grade;

Second: By paving the roadway of said street twenty-four feet in width with reinforced concrete pavement;

Third: By constructing sub-drains, if necessary;

Fourth: By constructing street monuments;

Fifth: By constructing catch-basins, if necessary;

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, has called a special election of the legal voters of the city of Roseburg, which will be held in said city on Friday, the 16th day of May, 1924, for the purpose of voting upon a proposed Charter Amendment to the existing Municipal Charter of the City of Roseburg as proposed by Ordinance No. 810, adopted by the Common Council March 18th, 1924 and approved by the Mayor March 20th, 1924, which said proposed charter amendment is in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

"Be it enacted by the people of the city of Roseburg, Oregon, that Subdivision 56, of section 33 of the existing municipal charter of the city of Roseburg, Oregon, as enacted by the legislative assembly of the state of Oregon, by 'An act to incorporate the city of Roseburg and to repeal all acts and parts of acts in conflict therewith,' to-wit: An act entitled 'An act to incorporate the city of Roseburg,' approved October 2, 1872, and an act entitled 'An act to amend an act entitled 'An act to incorporate the city of Roseburg,' approved February 1880, and an act to amend an act entitled 'An act to incorporate the city of Roseburg,' approved February 23, 1888, also an act amendatory of said act, filed in the office of the secretary of state, February 19, 1891; and also an act to incorporate the city of Roseburg, and to define the powers thereof, approved February 25, 1895; and to repeal all acts amendatory thereof and in conflict therewith, (which act was filed in the office of the secretary of state on February 22, 1905,) and as amended by vote of the people at an election held May 6th, 1907, and as amended by vote of the people of said city at the general election held therein on the 5th day of October, 1914, and as amended by vote of the people of said city at an election held therein on the 3rd day of June, 1915, and as amended by vote of the people of said city at an election held therein on the 21st day of May, 1920, and as amended by vote of the people of the city of Roseburg at an election held therein on the 6th day of November, 1923, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"56. The Common Council of the city of Roseburg is hereby given power and authority to purchase one fire truck having thereon a pump for the pumping of water, and also to purchase such other fire fighting equipment as may be necessary to adequately equip the fire department of said City; and to issue and sell negotiable bonds of the city of Roseburg, Oregon, the principal sum of which shall not exceed \$15,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds for the acquisition of said fire truck and fire fighting equipment. The bonds hereby authorized shall be in such form and of such denomination and payable as to principal at such times as the Council may determine, said time not to exceed twenty years. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually. The council is hereby authorized to levy a tax annually in addition to all other taxes authorized to be levied by the charter of the city of Roseburg to pay the interest on said bonds as the same become due and to pay said bonds at any time therein authorized. The indebtedness authorized by this charter amendment is in addition to all other indebtedness of said city already incurred or authorized, and is not to be considered as affected by any limits of indebtedness in said charter or elsewhere. All parts of the charter of the city of Roseburg and all ordinances or parts of ordinances of said city in conflict with the provisions of this charter amendment are hereby amended, modified or repealed as the case may require in order that this amendment may be in effect."

Said ordinance further provides the form of the title in which said proposed amendment shall be submitted on the official ballot and declares an emergency, which said form is as follows, to-wit:

Shall the charter of the city of Roseburg be amended to authorize the Common Council to purchase a fire truck and fire fighting equipment and to issue \$15,000.00 of six per cent bonds to provide funds therefor, and to levy a tax to pay said bonds and the interest thereon? Vote "Yes" or "No."

500—Yes.

501—No.

Said ordinance further provides that said election shall commence at the hour of eight o'clock in the forenoon of said day and shall continue until eight o'clock in the evening of said day and provides that an adjournment of one hour at one o'clock may be had as provided by law.

And said ordinance further provides that the persons appointed by the county court of Douglas county, Oregon, as Judges and Clerks to conduct the primary election to be held in said city on said date are thereby appointed as Judges and Clerks to conduct said city election and the polling places designated by said county court for the holding of said primary election are thereby designated as the polling places at which said special city election shall be conducted.

"56.
