He was married in February 1899 to Mary Velene Kubli, and the following year returned to Canyon City and helped organize the Grant County Bank, which he managed until he entered the hotel business at Heppner, remaining there until 1904 when he purchased an interest in the Imperial Hotel in Portland this business having been under his direction since that time.

## CREW OF BRITISH SHIP IS IN IRONS

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) BOSTON, April 21.—Because of a mutiny aboard, the British steamer, Newton Bay, loaded with alcohol, has sent a wireless message asking for aid. The steamer was in a gale 65 miles off the coast. The crew was in irons below decks, having mutinied when demands for a pay increase of \$10 a month was refused.

## PINCHOT SAYS BOOZE ISSUE IS PARAMOUNT

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) PHILADELPHIA, April 21.—The withdrawal of his support from Governor Pinchot for one of Pennsylvania's delegates at large to the republican national convention by Representative William S. Vare, a republican leader of this city and the liquor question prompted the congressman's increased interest in tomorrow's primaries. There is much speculation as to the effect Mr. Vare's opposition will have on the governor's candidacy. The congressman announced he would support Ralph Beaver Strassburger, wealthy Morristown publisher, for delegate at large against the government who is one of the seven slated candidates of the republican state organization. Declaring that "liquor or law enforcement" is the issue and that the Philadelphia organization "is regular when liquor is regular, otherwise, not," Governor Pinchot last night said the state organization
