

REGISTRATION IS SLIGHTLY LOWER

For Coming Election
Decrease Over Last
Official Check.

DEMOCRATS ARE TAKEN OFF

County Clerk Strikes Inactive
Voters off His Books—
Democrats Show
Slight Gain.

The number of registered voters in
the county has fallen off, accord-
ing to the records compiled by Coun-
ty Clerk Riddle from the poll
books which have been made up for
the coming primary election to be
held May 16. The falling off, how-
ever, is in the republican party for

the democrats have increased their
registration over the former check.

The total registration at the last
previous count was 9,805. This year
the total is 9,466. The republicans
dropped from 6,616 to 6,300, while the
democrats increased from 2,623 to
2,681. Those who signed miscellane-
ous, including prohibitionists, social-
ists, etc., dropped from 566 to 485.
The number of women voters de-
creased from 3,546 to 3,441, while the
male voters dropped from 6,259 to
6,025.

The registration figures for the
coming primary show that there are
3,989 men registered as republicans
and 2,311 women. The democrats
have 1,739 men and 942 women. Re-
gistered as miscellaneous there are
297 men and 188 women.

County Clerk Riddle states that
he has been making a very careful
check of the registration list of the
county. He found in his former check
a great many names of persons who
had moved away, were dead, or who
had not voted for a long period of
time. These were weeded out making
a cut in the previous count over the
year before. This election the same
course has been pursued and the re-
duction shown is not a lack of few-
er voters, but is merely the result of
taking out the names of those who
either have moved away, have died,
or who have failed to exercise their
right of franchise during the past
two years.

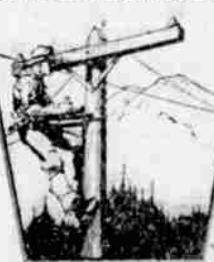
