**CONSULTATIONS ON REPARATIONS START**

BRUSSELS, April 29.—"Simply preliminary conversations," is the way yesterday's consultations in Paris between Premier Poincare of France and Premier Theunis and Foreign Minister Hymans of Belgium are described in official circles here. No decisions were reached at these conferences. It is declared, this action being reserved for further meetings to be held after the French elections, notably the meeting between Premier Poincare and Prime Minister Macdonald of Great Britain.

**PRINCE MURAT IS ASSAULTED IN RIOT**

SOUILLAX, France, April 29.—Prince Murat, member of the chamber of deputies and a descendant of Napoleon's famous companion-in-arms, Joachim Murat, king of Naples, was assaulted in a campaign rally here last night by hoodlums who beat him severely and threw him from the platform. The prince today had several bad face and body wounds but onlookers agreed that he took his punishment like one of his illustrious forebears among the old guardsmen.

**BELLINGHAM STORE IS \$400,000 LOSS**

BELLINGHAM, Wash., April 29.—Loss as a result of a fire which swept from the basement to the roof of the six-story concrete building owned by the B. B. Furniture company here early last night was estimated today at \$400,000, practically all of which is covered by insurance.

The origin of the fire which started in the tower part of one of the elevator shafts and swept through the building so rapidly that firemen battled in vain against it, has not been determined. Plans for rebuilding were announced.

**OHIO VOTERS SELECT PARTY DELEGATES**

COLUMBUS, Ohio, April 29.—Ohio voters went to the polls today to select delegates to the national conventions of the two major political parties and to register their preference as to candidates to be named by the convention. Little interest was being taken and Secretary of State Thad Brown declared he did not expect more than 500,000 to vote.

Final statements of leaders of the Coolidge, Johnson, McAdoo and Cox campaigns predict victory for their respective candidates. The most interesting feature of today's election is the contest of former Attorney-General Daugherty, a Coolidge candidate for delegate at large. Effort of Johnson supporters have centered largely on attacks of the former attorney-general since his retirement from the cabinet.

Daugherty in 1920 was a Harding delegate who was defeated.
