GOLD DISCOVERED UNDER HIS GARAGE

GRASS VALLEY, Calif., May 7.—When Atherton B. Snyder started to excavate for an underground gasoline tank in his garage here, he struck gold-bearing ore a few feet below the surface.

Mr. Snyder had the ore assayed and found that it contained a considerable quantity of gold. He kept going deeper and getting more gold and reported to the Chester N. Weaver Company, Studebaker distributors at San Francisco, that between selling Studebaker cars and mining gold he had his hands full. In a few weeks, as the shaft sunk deeper, his garage was full too—full of dirt from the excavation.

The miners were bringing up so much ore that the Snyder service department was getting so crowded for comfort. By that time, however, he had taken enough money out of the garage to pay for the garage.

But the congested condition could not continue. It reached a point where Snyder had to give up the mine or give up the garage. Since so many Studebakers were being sold in Grass Valley, Mr. Snyder began to do some figuring. Studebaker had been doing business for 72 years, he knew, while his gold mine might "peter out" any day. He delivered on the problem for a short time and decided to close up his gold mine and stick to his Studebakers.

He closed up the shaft leading into the garage and sold the underground rights to a gold mining company which is now working underneath the surface of the garage. But Mr. Snyder stipulated in his contract that the mining operations were not to interfere with his garage business.

When asked if he didn't have difficulty making up his mind to abandon the gold mine, Mr. Snyder said:

"Not much. Why bother with a gold mine when you've such a substantial business as the contract for Studebaker? A gold mine is a fickle thing, uncertain at best, liable to quit you at any time. But selling Studebakers is a sure thing. I'll keep my garage." And he has.

Johnson, 293,684; Coolidge, 219,934.

McAdoo, 78,033.

No preference, 13,791.

On the foregoing tabulation, the Coolidge ticket had a majority of 16,359 over the Johnson delegates. The McAdoo delegation for the same number of precincts was 64,242. Fifty-two of the 58 counties are represented in the figures.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 7.—Returns from 2977 complete precincts representing all but two of the state's counties, gave in yesterday's presidential primary: Johnson 217,556; Coolidge 240,524; majority for Coolidge 22,928; McAdoo 85,738; no preference 13,179.

Missing precincts numbered 1897 of which 651 were in Los Angeles county. Lassen and Modoc were the counties which had failed to report up to 11 a. m. today. Their precincts totaled 61.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 7.—Returns from 4956 precincts of the state's 9464 give from yesterday's

primary:

Johnson 214,998; Coolidge, 236,736; McAdoo 84,446, no preference 14,896; Coolidge Majority 21,738.

These figures include returns from all counties in California except Lassen and Modoc. The precincts not accounted for numbered 2018, of which 686 were in Los Angeles county.

LOS ANGELES, May 7.—Los Angeles county returns from 1186 precincts out of 1816 today showed a strong lead for Coolidge, almost 2 to 1. The count was Johnson 46,605; Coolidge 80,174; McAdoo 28,761; no preference 4674.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 7.—The result of the presidential preference primary in California, in which he was defeated on the face of returns today, "is no real disaster," United States Senator Hiram W. Johnson said today in a telegram from Washington to his state headquarters here.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 7.—Returns from 5,448 complete precincts from all the state's counties except Modoc, gave in yesterday's presidential primary Johnson 225,562; Coolidge 254,679; McAdoo 91,147; no preference 15,950. Of the 1,526 missing precincts, 539 were in Los Angeles.

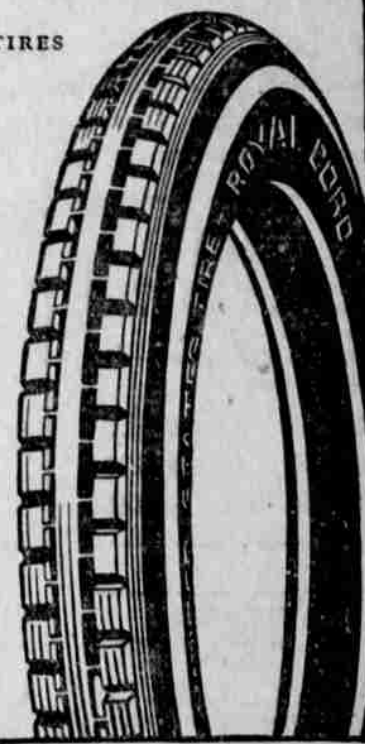

SACRAMENTO FIRE DESTROYS WHARVES

SACRAMENTO, May 7.—Fire which broke out shortly after noon on the Sacramento river waterfront had spread a half hour later along the river front for two blocks and damaged the city wharves, the Southern Pacific steamship landing and was threatening the destruction of other buildings.

A general alarm called out the entire city fire department.

The flames rapidly spread along a space of four blocks and enveloped the wharves and buildings of two river transportation companies. Unofficial reports stated there were five square and distinct blazes which merged into one.

MERCURY TO PASS BETWEEN EARTH, SUN

CHICAGO, May 7.—The planet Mercury will pass between the earth and the sun today, starting its transit at 2:42 p. m. central time, according to the figures of Professor Philip Fox of Dearborn observatory, Northwestern University. According to Father Miguel Selva of the Manila, Philippines, observatory, the rare astronomical event can not be viewed again in the United States until 1953.

Persons desiring to witness the transit should use an astronomical telescope of three inches or more.

GASOLINE PRICES TAKING A DROP
