SUN YAT SEN IS REPORTED DEAD

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
SHANGHAI, May 13.—Sun Yat-sen, president of the southern government of China is reported to have died from brain fever.
The report which reached here from Hongkong, has not yet been confirmed but according to reliable information received there Sun Yat-sen had been unconscious for two days.

HONGKONG, May 13.—Dr. Sun Yat-sen, president of the southern government of China is seriously ill with brain fever, but there is no confirmation of his death, which has been reported.
It has been known for sometime that Dr. Sun Yat-sen was not in the best of health. The vernacular papers state that he is suffering with brain fever, possibly cerebro-spinal fever. He is reported to be lying at his headquarters attended by foreign and Chinese doctors, with his son in constant attendance. His death would be kept a secret as long as possible as the news would probably lead to chaos in Canton.

NEW YORK, May 13.—Ma Soo representative in the United States of the southern government of China declared today he had received no official confirmation of the report that President Sun Yat-sen of the southern government had died of brain fever. Mr. Soo said he had been informed that Dr. Sun had been seriously ill for several days.
Dr. Sun who was the first provisional president of China and who has been called variously "the father of the republic" and the "George Washington of the Far East," has had more action crammed into his 62 years than any other Oriental of his time.
After organizing the government in the south, Dr. Sun wielded in favor of Yuan Shih-kai, a northern leader. In the trouble of Shih-kai's regime when Dr. Sun found strong forces arrayed against him he es-
