FATHER OF LOCAL MAN SUES FOR CAVES

Walter C. Burch, of Gresham, father of Earl Burch, of the F-1 Garage, has entered a suit in Josephine county to obtain money for the use by the Oregon resort company of the Oregon caves. Burch claims to have discovered the caves in 1885 and claims that he filed on the land at that time. The Gresham Outlook gives the following account of the filing of the claim:

The ownership of the Oregon caves in Josephine county must be decided in court, according to Walter C. Burch of Gresham who claims to have discovered them in 1885 and to have filed on them immediately, together with a partner, H. D. Harkness. Suit to test his claim was filed with the county clerk at Grants Pass on Wednesday of this week. The complaint is against the Oregon Resort company. He asks for \$5000 damages and an additional judgment of \$5000 against the company to pay him for their occupancy during the past year.

In his complaint Burch sets forth that prior to May 2, 1885 he discovered the greater portion of the caves and for more than three years he lawfully possessed 160 acres including the caves and the adjacent land. On the second day of May, 1885 he, with his partner, filed a claim which was duly recorded in the office of the county clerk of Josephine county. The notice of claim reads as follows:

"Notice is hereby given that we, the undersigned citizens of the United States, claim 160 acres of land covering the cave in this vicinity together with the said caves or anything that may be found within the boundaries of said location, said boundaries to conform to the United States land surveys; that said boundaries will be definitely marked as soon as a survey can be had, or within the next 60 days, and that we intend to begin the construction of a trail or wagon road to said caves in the near future."

"H. D. Harkness and Walter C. Burch, locators."

In an interview concerning this claim several months ago Mr. Burch told the Outlook of the efforts of himself and his partner to secure the land under the Stone and Timber act, but the country was not surveyed and title could not be obtained at that time. The partners held on and worked for three years, clearing and building trails, and expended \$1500 on the project, occupying the land under squatter's rights. A number of men were required to construct the trails and do other work. In 1886 a house of shakes was built, camp grounds were cleared and accommodations provided for those who might come. In the fall, 420 feet of ladders were removed from the caves by Mr. Burch and put under shelter for the winter.

During the summer of 1887 Mr. Burch completed the work of clearing around the caves and spent the latter part of the summer exploring and guiding those who came to see the wonders. There were not many sight seers at that time and in the fall he came out.

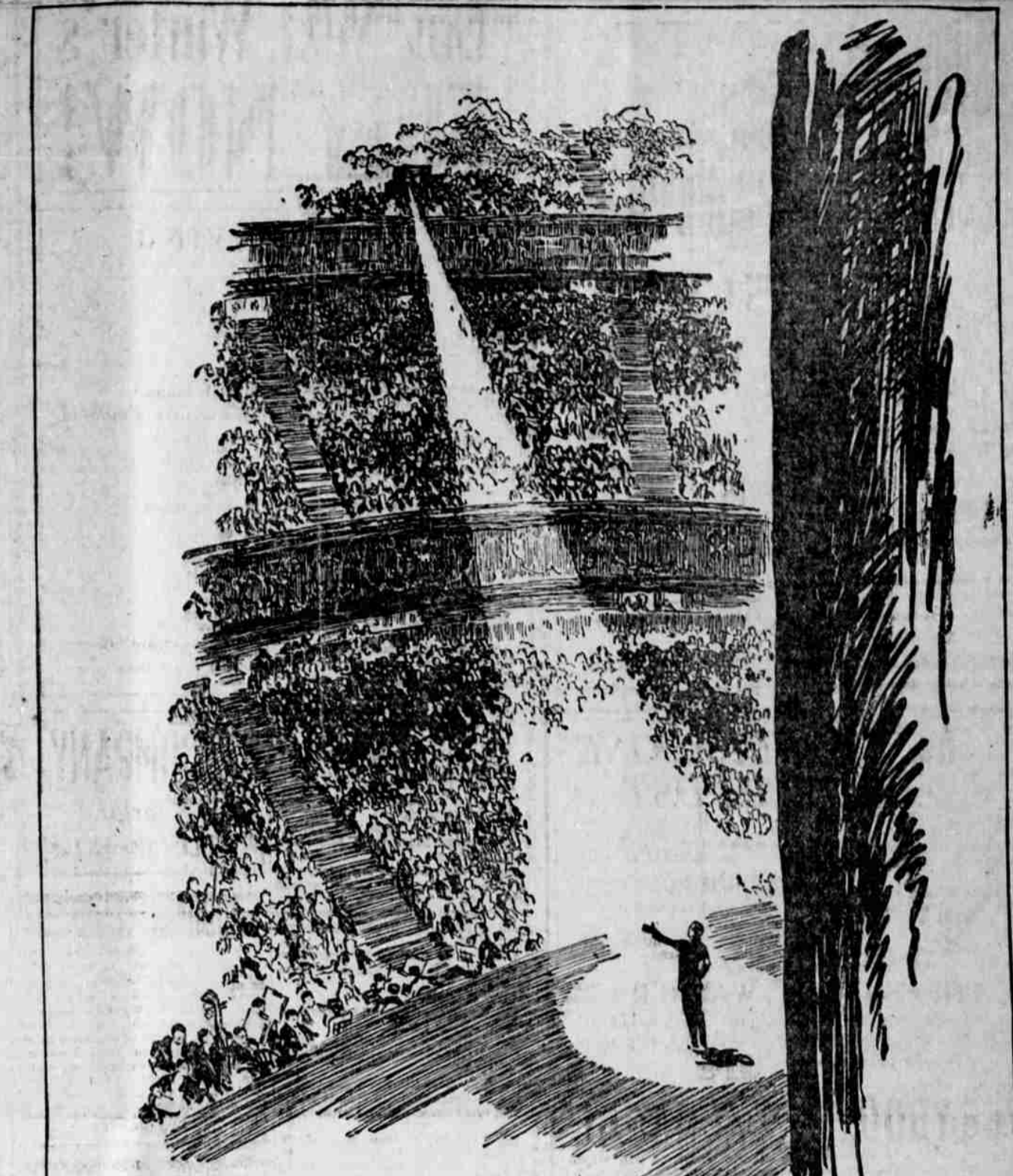
SUPREME COURT TO HEAR SCHOOL BILL

PORTLAND, Ore., May 13.—Appeal to the United States supreme court in the compulsory school attendance bill injunction suit, is to be begun immediately, Attorney General Van Winkle announced today upon his return from Salem, to resume active charge of the Multnomah county bridge investigation.

Indictments against County Commissioners Rudeen and Walker and Robert E. Kromers, bridge engineer, were returned by the Multnomah county grand jury Saturday, charging bribery.

"The state will not wait the full three months to complete the appeal in the school bill case," said Van Winkle, "for the reason that this is a case affecting thousands of persons and I believe that final decision should be had at as early a date as possible. For this reason, I shall make every effort to file the appeal promptly."

An injunction was issued March 21, by United States Circuit Judge Gilbert and District Judges Wolverton and Bean, sitting en banc, in Portland restraining Governor Pierce, Attorney General Van Winkle and District Attorney Stanley Myers of Multnomah county, from enforcing the school attendance bill passed by the

voters at the 1922 election. The bill, which was declared unconstitutional, would require after September 1, 1923, compulsory attendance at public schools of all children between the ages of 8 and 16 years.

Discussing the Multnomah county investigation, Van Winkle said that additional phases of the inquiry would be promptly presented to the grand jury and the results of that body's judgment made public as rapidly as is consistent with a thorough hearing, for the reason that the public is entitled to know at an early date, the facts as revealed by this investigation.
