### PORTLAND MEN WILL SOON GET TRIAL

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

PORTLAND, May 28.—Early trials of men indicted last night as the climax to the county bridge investigation was promised today by Willis S. Moore, assistant attorney-general and other officers who aid in conducting the probe.

"In justice to both the state and the accused we would like to have the cases tried as soon as possible," said Moore. "The state will be ready to proceed very soon."

Those against whom the indictments were returned by the grand jury yesterday were Charles S. Rudeen, Dow W. Walker and J. H. Rantlin, former county commissioners, charged with malfeasance in office and five contractors, officers of the three firms awarded the Willamette river bridge contracts, who are charged with conspiracy in submitting a roll-back bid on the work to destroy competition on a public contract. One secret indictment on the bridge matter also was returned.

### CARPENTIER AND GIBBONS ARE READY

MICHIGAN CITY, Ind., May 28.—Tommy Gibbons, St. Paul light heavyweight, today starts tapering off training for his 10 round contest with Georges Carpentier here next Saturday while his French opponent said that he is conditioned to the minute.

Carpentier is superbly conditioned, ready for battle, critics believe. "I can go in the ring tomorrow," Carpentier told newspapermen after a workout for their benefit. For a big contest without title involved, the Saturday event promises to attract a large gate receipt. All the 22 seats, the choicest in the arena, have been sold or reserved.

Carpentier will receive \$70,000, including \$50,000 for expenses, while Gibbons will get 30 per cent of the receipts. If the gate hits the \$50,000 mark, Gibbons will draw down \$20,000.

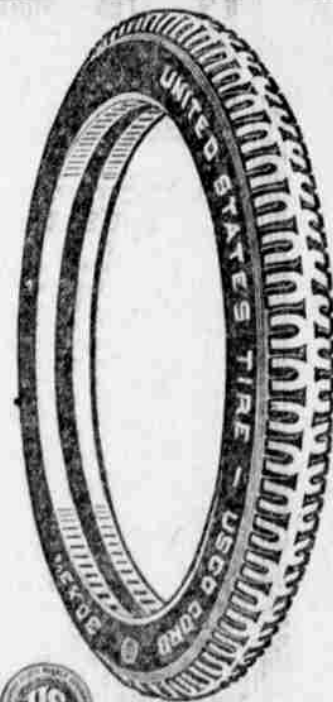
