SUPREME COURT DECIDES MINE CASE

The verdict of the circuit court jury in the case of Charles C. Hanford and others against B. O. Criggen, et al., has been sustained by the Supreme court in a decision just handed down. This case involves rights to mining property and has attracted considerable attention.

According to the evidence brought out in the trial of the case, B. O. Criggen, an old prospector took up a number of claims on Drew Creek, a tributary of Elk Creek about 30 years ago. These were quite valuable mineral claims, and the old man worked hard on them keeping up his assessment work. He spent between \$20,000 and \$40,000 during the time that he held them, and finally died there, his body being found in one of the several cabins.

Immediately following his death Criggen and five other defendants moved on to the claim and took possession, and worked the claims. The plaintiffs, heirs of B. O. Criggen, brought suit to eject the defendants. It was claimed that the heirs had not abandoned the property and that the time for completing assessment work had not expired and that consequently the plaintiffs were entitled to their rights in the property.

The case was heard in the circuit court, there being many technical issues relating to the mining laws involved. The jury returned a verdict in favor of the plaintiffs and ejecting the defendants. An appeal was taken to the supreme court where the lower court was upheld.

OKLAHOMA TOWN IS SWEEPED BY TORNADO

OKLAHOMA CITY, May 29.—Nine known deaths, more than a score injured and property damage estimated at more than \$300,000 was the toll of a tornado late yesterday, Wetumka, an oil town of 2,500 inhabitants paid the greatest toll, seven persons losing their lives there when 30 homes were razed. At Warner, a small farm center near Okmulgee, two persons were killed and most of the town's business section was destroyed. Checotah, in McIntosh county, suffered considerable damage from wind and rainfall.
