WEATHER IS SCORCHING COAST

FRANCISCO, May 29.—Hot sun, accompanied in some localities by high north winds with a strong blast in them is increasing the hazard to forests and measurably, it was announced by the United States bureau.

A hot spell centered in California yesterday, but was spreading over all of Oregon, Washington and Idaho. A great irregular pressure is keeping out the ocean breezes and drawing a hot north wind. These are melting the water from all the streams and reservoirs and melting the last of the winter snows on the Sierras.

The combined warmth and drought conditions are bringing California to the point of a water shortage crisis, the weather bureau said. The mountain streams are much lower than usual and many of the lowland streams are dried up altogether.

The highest temperature yesterday was 88 and today promised to exceed that figure.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE EAST AVENUE

Notice is hereby given, that at a meeting of the common council of the city of Roseburg, Oregon, held on the 19th day of May, 1924, the following resolution was adopted:

"Resolved that the common council of the city of Roseburg, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary and hereby proposes to improve East Avenue from the north line of Douglas street to a point 450 feet north thereof, in the city of Roseburg, Oregon, in the following manner:

First: By grading said street to the proper sub-grade;
Second: By paving the roadway of said street nineteen feet in width with reinforced concrete pavement;
Third: By constructing concrete sidewalks on each side of said pavement four feet in width and abutting the curbs thereof;
Fourth: By constructing sub-drains, if necessary;
Fifth: By constructing street monuments;
Sixth: By laying vitrified sewer pipe, if necessary;
Seventh: By constructing concrete curbs;
Eighth: By constructing catch-basins, if necessary.

Said improvements are to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of Roseburg, Oregon, and the grade, plans, specifications and estimates of the city engineer, filed in the office of the city recorder on the 19th day of May, 1924, which said grade, plans, specifications and estimates are hereby approved and adopted.

JAPANESE PROTEST REACHES EMBASSY

WASHINGTON, May 29.—The Japanese protest against the new immigration law reached the Japanese embassy here today by cable.

Because of its great length sometime will be required to decode and study it before it is formally presented to the state department.

Meantime, Ambassador Hanabara will make no appointments to see Secretary Hughes for the purpose of presenting his government's views.

Embassy officials appeared doubtful that the communication could be put in shape for presentation today. They declined to discuss the contents of the note in any way. It was described by them as "very long." Mr. Hughes conferred at length with President Coolidge but it was indicated no authoritative comment on the Japanese question would be forthcoming until the government is ready to make its reply to Tokyo.
