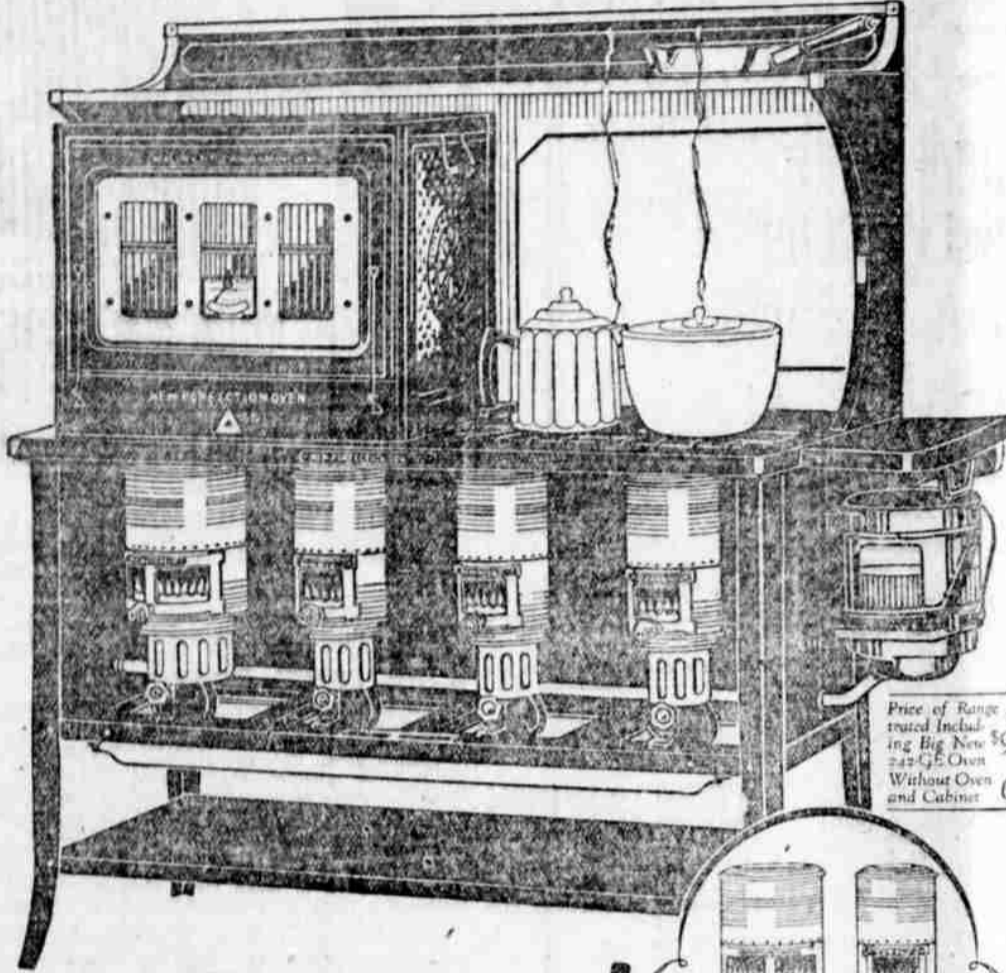

TEST RIGHT OF GOV. TO APPOINT DEPUTIES

SALEM, June 4.—Quo warranto proceedings to test out the authority of the governor to appoint special prosecutors in the counties of Oregon were filed in the supreme court today by Jay H. Upson of Bend.

When governor Pierce named Farnham as special prosecutor he informed County Treasurer Clyde McKay that Farnham was to have control of the county prohibition fund, but the county treasurer refused to allow either Farnham or Moore to have access to the fund so the county's prohibition fund is not being used.

CLEVELAND, June 4.—At the closing of the first delegate contest today the republican national committee unanimously voted to seat W. T. Gallagher and Thomas L. Jones, the latter a negro, both of Washington, D. C., as delegates at large from the district of Columbia.
