GIVES TEN REASONS FAVORING SMITH

NEW YORK, June 6.—Ten reasons why the democratic national convention should nominate Governor Smith are specified by Franklin G. Roosevelt, chairman of the New York state Smith-committee, in a letter sent to each delegate and alternate.

Among the reasons were: "His strength is greatest in the doubtful states where strength is most needed."

"One reason for his strength is his following of independent voters."

"He is an expert on the affairs of government with an experience unequalled by that of any man alive."

"He has at once the undivided support of labor and the confidence of business men."

"Above every other executive in America he has stood for fearless enforcement of the law."

"Although personally believing that the Volstead act should be amended, he not only served notice on every peace officer of the state holding him to strict accountability for enforcement of the law, but he called a conference of all enforcing officers to devise means for better enforcement of the law and secured an increased appropriation of \$400,000 to add to the force of the state police which has for one of its chief duties the suppression of smuggling of liquor over the Canadian and neighboring borders."

MANDRONES IS FOUND GUILTY

THE DAILES, June 6.—A verdict of guilty was returned early today by the jury in the trial of Ted Mandrones, charged with complicity in the Mosier Bank robbery last November.

Final instructions were read to the jury late yesterday by Circuit Judge Wilson before a crowded court room. The jury, composed of ten men and two women, was out eight hours. Sentence will be passed on Mandrones next Monday, and it was believed in court house circles that C. R. Williams, star witness for the state and who has confessed to connection with the robbery, will be sentenced at the same time.

SHINGLES DESTROYED IN BAD MILL FIRE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) CLATSkanie, June 6.—Thirty-nine trucks of shingles valued at \$10,000, were destroyed late yesterday by a blaze that originated in the dry kilns of the Gold Medal shingle mills near Birkfeld. The fire spread and burned toward Westport. Mill hands and farmers are said to have saved the mill. Fire which started Wednesday in the Porter-Carstens camp destroyed 1,500,000 feet of logs and three donkey engines according to information reaching here.

RAIN AT HOOD RIVER.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) HOOD RIVER, June 6.—Heavy showers prevailed over all mid-Columbia fruit districts last night. Orchardists declare the showers will be worth thousands of dollars. The rain too, eliminates the fire hazards in forests around Mount Hood and Mount Adams.

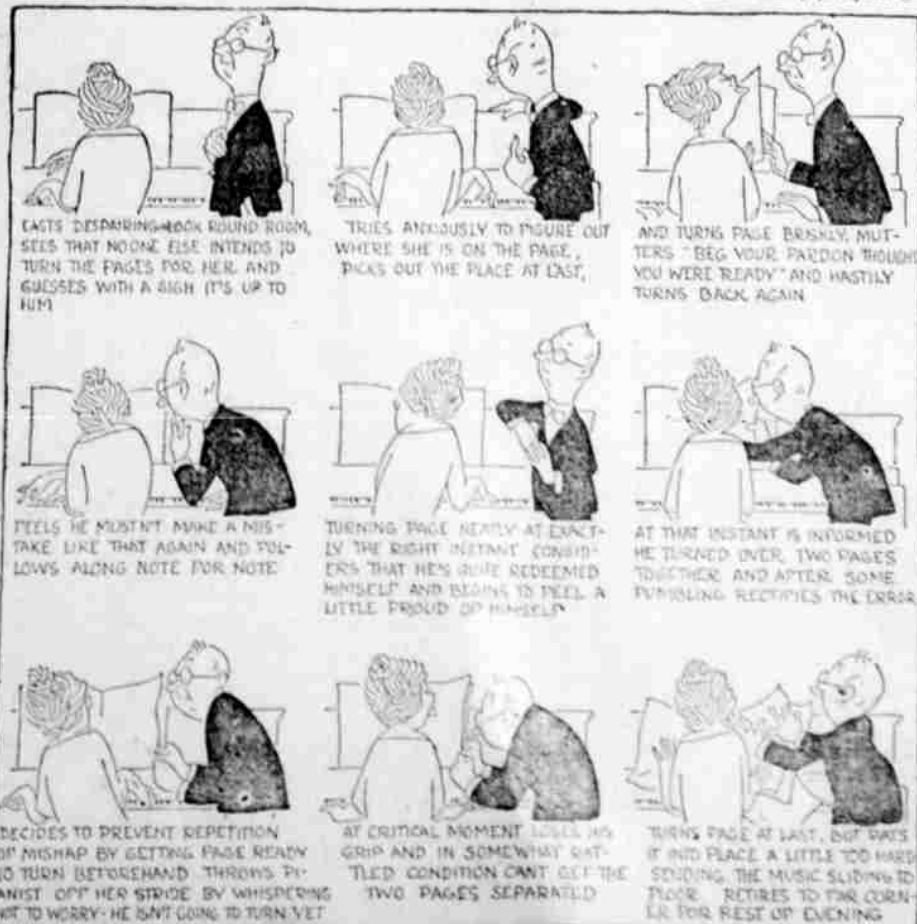
