The big republican convention at Cleveland, Ohio, is occupying the attention of the nation today. With the nomination of Coolidge for president and his running mate, and a platform pieced together to weather the storm always in evidence before the close of a national election, there will be little left to mince over.

Vacations in the country are to be supplied this year to at least 71,000 children of New York city, as reported by the Children's Welfare Federation. Similar work is being done in other centers of population. It is a fine charity. The child that grows up without having seen any green grass except in some city park or lawn, who never saw a cow or a sheep, who has not followed a running brook or looked for fish in its clear waters, who never jumped into the good old swimming hole, has missed something of a child's natural birthright.

Various communities throughout the county are organizing chamber of commerce bodies this week with a view of becoming better identified with the state at large, and in the meantime adding much prestige and strength to their individual community. This is an excellent spirit for any town to show and one that is bound to bring good results for the time and investment given the worthy efforts put forward by enterprising citizens.

One of the most important projects before the people of this community at the present time is the offer of the government to finance the North Umpqua highway project, with limited financial assistance from Douglas county. This road, and the project now well under way leading to the lower Umpqua, are both of vital interest to the county at large, and upon their completion will become of great commercial value to this particular section of the state.

Attention continues to be excited by the instances where women have operated as bandits, bootleggers, and other criminals. A bobbed hair bandit or bootlegger is sure of unlimited publicity. CANNERY TO START SEASON MONDAY

The Umpqua Valley Cannery will be ready for operation in its new location on Spruce street on Monday, according to manager A. J. Geddes, who announces that the plant will operate for the coming month on cherries and logan berries. Owing to the fact that both of these crops are light, the cannery will not be operated to full capacity at present.

The machinery is being put in place now, and by the end of the week everything will be in readiness for the season. The new location is admirably adapted for cannery purposes and the building is light, well ventilated, and so constructed that it may be kept clean and sanitary at all times.

Mr. Geddes reports that the cannery officials are anxious to see the farmers of the county grow more diversified crops. Rhubarb, beets, gooseberries, blackberries, raspberries and strawberries, are among the crops most needed by the cannery.

VISCOUNT ISHII TO BE AMBASSADOR

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) TOKIO, June 11.—Viscount Kihichiro Ishii, who won the Lansing-Ishii agreement between the United States and Japan is indicated on reliable authority.

Selection of a new ambassador to the United States to succeed Mr. Hamihara is one of the first important tasks confronting Japan's new cabinet. Viscount Ishii, who now is ambassador to France, already is well known to America due to his presence in this country as an special envoy for negotiation of an agreement with Robert Lansing, the late president Wilson's first secretary of state, and also for an earlier visit in connection with the difficult situation arising from the 1907 anti-Japanese disturbances.

A vice-minister of foreign affairs, and in 1916 and 1917, as minister, he had many contacts with American statesmen. In his published utterances regarding relations between his country and the United States he always has sounded a strongly optimistic note.

WASHINGTON, June 11.—Tokio dispatches indicating the probable selection of Viscount Kihichiro Ishii as ambassador to the United States were received with keen interest in official quarters here today, but comment was withheld pending receipt of formal notification of the change.

Viscount Ishii is well known in the United States, both for his wide experience in the diplomatic field and his great knowledge of American-Japanese relations. In the negotiation of the Lansing-Ishii agreement relating to China he was in the public eye for many months. He has an essential knowledge of immigration question which have arisen between the two countries.
