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FLINT CAR ON TRIP AROUND RIM OF U. S.

A Flint Six Touring model was driven into Roseburg this morning by Wm. Horstman, of Oakland, California, who bought the machine on a unique plan. It was guaranteed the purchaser by the factory at Oakland that the car would make the trip around the rim of the United States, a distance of 15,000 miles, with only six service calls for oil. The car, when inspected by Leo Rapp shortly before noon today, had traveled 2,800 miles, and the motor was in perfect condition. The hood is closed and sealed at each inspection by properly authorized agents, and Mr. Rapp sent the machine on to Portland, its next stop. Mr. Rapp will wire his report to the Flint people at Oakland tonight. In speaking of the car this afternoon, Mr. Rapp stated the motor was in need of no attention whatever, and he believes it will make the trip and have considerable to its credit at the end of the long tour. If the car fails, Mr. Horstman is to get another Flint right out of the factory to replace the machine he is driving today.

MOTOR BUSES TAKE STREET CAR TRADE

There are 40,000 motor buses operating in America and 80,000 taxicabs. No less than 55,000,000 ten-cent fares were collected last year by a single motor bus company in New York City.

In Everett, Wash., a city of 30,000 population, the street car company has discarded its rail equipment and switched over entirely to rubber-tired motor buses. The Milwaukee Electric Railway company operates nearly 160 buses over 600 miles of roads and covers 44,000,000 bus-miles a year—40,000 miles per bus!

Oakland, Cal., a thriving city of well over 200,000 population, plans to replace its entire street car system, starting shortly with 50 30-passenger buses, operating on 5-cent fares.

That this replacing of rail transport by motor buses is feasible is proved by the experience of London, England, which has no street cars at all in its great business, theatre and shopping districts. London has nearly 4000 motor buses, which carried 724,500,000 persons during the first 32 weeks of 1933, as against only 187,000,000 carried by the great London subway system. Motor bus traffic increased 21 per cent during this period, as compared with 1932, while the subway traffic decreased.

Owing to the fact that the dry weather had advanced the grazing season, the forest service is giving permission to stock men holding grazing permits to place their stock on the forests on June 15, instead of July 1, as provided in the permits. The feed on the forest is now in excellent condition, Mr. Neal reports, and the service desires to utilize it while it is at its best. The feed on some of the lower levels is fast disappearing, and many stockmen will doubtless avail themselves of the opportunity to place their stock on the range at an earlier date.

JAPS SEEK PEACE.

TOKIO, June 11.—Peace and international friendship will form the basis policies of the new Japanese cabinet, the incoming premier, Viscount Kato, declared tonight in a statement to the Associated Press. The ministry formed by the viscount yesterday will assume office tomorrow.

The statement said: "My ministry will contribute to world peace by promoting friendly relations with all powers, in pursuance of the foreign policy hitherto carried out. My cabinet also will undertake domestic reforms in the interest of the whole nation."
