OSTEOPATHY COLLEGES MAKING HEADWAY

ALBANY, June 24.—(Special to the News-Review)—Dr. Gerding, president of the college of osteopathic physicians and surgeons of Los Angeles, at the state convention today deplored the confusion in the public mind of osteopathy and its imitators. This, he says, is being overcome by the high standard of osteopathic colleges, four out of seven of which are now giving six years above the high school and granting bachelor or of science degree after four years and doctor of osteopathy after six years. Two osteopathic hospitals have just been completed and an osteopathic section placed in the county hospital under an osteopathic staff, making three osteopathic hospitals in Los Angeles. Dr. Gerding spoke on treatment of nervous diseases. There is a large attendance from all over the state at the convention.
